Portfolio continuity with key additions

Narendra Modi was sworn in as India's Prime Minister for a third consecutive term on June 9, alongside 71 other Ministers. The new Council of Ministers includes 30 Cabinet Ministers, five Ministers of State with Independent Charge, and 36 Ministers of State.

The big four retain portfolios

The new National Democratic Alliance (NDA) administration has retained the composition of the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS), with Rajnath Singh, Amit Shah, Nirmala Sitharaman, and S. Jaishankar continuing to lead Defence, Home, Finance, and External Affairs portfolios, respectively.

Economic ministries retained by BJP

Several other BJP leaders have been allocated their previous portfolios including Nitin Gadkari (Road Transport and Highways), Piyush Goyal (Commerce and Industry), Sarbananda Sonowal (Ports, Shipping, and Waterways), Virendra Kumar (Social Justice and Empowerment), Ashwini Vaishnaw (Railways, Electronics, and Information Technology), Hardeep Singh Puri (Petroleum and Natural Gas) and Bhupender Yadav (Environment, Forest, and Climate Change).

Allies and talent from the states bolster the administrative bench

The inclusion of six former chief ministers and 11 allies in the council brings valuable administrative and policymaking experience, especially from large, complex states.

The Big Push

As the Modi government's third term begins and various ministries get ready to roll out their 100-day agendas, a series of reforms are likely, with a focus on economic growth, taxation, infrastructure development, digital innovation, and governance improvement.

- **Impetus to exports:** In the coming years, the government is expected to focus on Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) with major trading partners and blocs, including the UK, Oman, and the European Union (EU). Manufacturing is a key governmental priority for boosting private investment and generating employment, and we expect a focus on the impetus to enhance exports.
- Ease of doing business and tax reforms: The government is prioritizing the decriminalization of certain key legal provisions to enhance the ease of doing business. This is an ongoing project for a working group of officials from the NITI Aayog—India's leading public policy think tank—and the Finance Ministry.
- **GST reforms:** Rationalization of India's Goods and Services Tax (GST) rates is a major reform that the government aims for in the third term. Additionally, GST relief to airlines and shipping lines on related party clauses is a likely measure undertaken in the first 100 days. For the insurance sector, the government is also likely to propose a waiver on GST for reinsurance, on the basis that it should not be considered a supply.
- **Rural economy boost:** To boost the rural economy, the government is likely to focus on the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Grameen (PMAY-G) for affordable houses. The PMAY-G provides cash support per housing unit to beneficiaries.
- **IBC amendments:** The government will focus on amendments to the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) to fast-track the resolution of distressed assets. A significant change under consideration is the project-wise resolution of distressed real estate companies.

Ajay Tamta



MoS, Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (Inducted)

- Ajay Tamta, is a third time Member of the Parliament, representing the Almora constituency (Uttarakhand) since 2014.
- He has previously served as the Minister of State for Textiles from 2016 to 2019.
- In 2012, he was elected as a member of the Uttarakhand Legislative Assembly from the Someshwar constituency.





Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Home Affairs; and Minister of Cooperation (Retained)

Amit Shah

- Amit Shah is a senior BJP leader who has played a pivotal role in BJP's growth trajectory in the past decade. He served as the BJP's National President from 2014 to 2020. He represents the Gandhingar Constituency in the Lok Sabha.
- Under his tenure, the Government of India abrogated Article 370 and passed the Citizenship Amendment Act.
- He further introduced the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023, Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, and Bhartiya Sakshya Adhiniyam 2023, which are aimed at replacing the Indian Penal Code, Code of Criminal Procedure, and the Indian Evidence Act.
- After resuming the office, he stated that the focus of MHA will remain on increased security and fight against terrorism, insurgency and Naxalism.



Annapurna Devi



Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Women and Child Development (Reallocated)

- Annapurna Devi began her political career after the death of her husband, Ramesh Yadav, a Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) legislator in 1998. She was elected to the Jharkhand Legislative Assembly, from Koderma (Vidhan Sabha constituency) as a member of the Rashtriya Janata Dal from 1998 to 2014.
- She won the Lok Sabha Election from Koderma (Jharkhand) constituency for the consecutive second time in 2024 and has been inducted as a minister for the first time.
- She is being seen as a prominent OBC face in the cabinet and has also served as the President of RJD's Jharkhand unit from 2014 to 2019.
- After swearing in, she stated that country should achieve women led development instead of women development.

Anupriya Patel



MoS, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare MoS, Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers (Reallocated)

- Anupriya Patel is a Member of Parliament (MP) from the Mirzapur (Uttar Pradesh) constituency and is the President of the Apna Dal party since 2016.
- She has served as MoS Health & Family Welfare from 2016 to 2019 and MoS Commerce & Industry from 2021 to 2024.
- She has previously served as a Member of the Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly from 2012 to 2014.



Arjun Ram Meghwal

→ Arjun Ram Meghwal has been elected as Member of parliament in Lok Sabha for the fourth consecutive time from Bikaner Constituency (Rajasthan).

✦ He has previously served as the Mos in the Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Corporate Affairs, & Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, Ministry of Heavy Industries and Ministry of Public Enterprises. He was awarded the Best Parliamentarian in 2013.

→ He was given the independent charge of the Ministry of Law and Justice in 2023.



Ashwini Vaishnaw



Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Railways (Retained)

Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting; (Reallocated) Cabinet minister, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (Retained)

- Ashwini Vaishnaw entered politics in 2019 after joining the Bhartiya Janata Party (BJP) and was elected to the Rajya Sabha from Odisha.
- He is former IAS officer from Odisha Cadre and has served as the Minister of Railways, Minister of Electronics and Information Technology, and Minister of Communications.
- During his first stint as minister, he focused on modernization of the railway infrastructure, including station transformations, station redevelopment programs, the commissioning of new rail lines, and widespread electrification efforts.
- After his stint in civil services, he worked in the corporate sector, holding significant positions at companies like GE Transportation and Siemens.

B.L. Verma



MoS, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution MoS, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (Reallocated)

- BL Verma was the Minister of State in the Ministry of Development of Northeastern Region and Minister of State in the Ministry of Co-operation in the previous government.
- He is the current state vice president of BJP Uttar Pradesh and the national vice president of the BJP OBC Morcha.
- He has served as the Chairman of UP State Construction and Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited since 2018.



Bandi Sanjay Kumar



- MoS, Ministry of Home Affairs (Newly Inducted)
- Bandi Sanjay Kumar, is a Member of Parliament from the Karimnagar (Andhra Pradesh) constituency, representing it since 2019.
- He has been a key figure in the BJP and has served as the Telangana's state president from 2020 until 2023. In July 2023, he was appointed as the National General Secretary of the BJP.
- He is a board member of the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Bibinagar, Hyderabad.



Bhagirath Choudhary



MoS, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare (Newly Inducted)

- Bhagirath Choudhary is a two-time member of the Lok Sabha from the Ajmer constituency, representing it since 2019.
- He has previously served as member of the Rajasthan Legislative Assembly representing Kishangarh and was the Chairman of the Committee on Environment from 2015 to 2017.

- Bhupathi Raju Srinivasa Varma started his political career as a student leader with AISAF in 1980, and later joined the BJP in 1988, eventually serving as the District President of BJP Bhimavaram Town from 1991 to 1997, and then as the West Godavari district president of BJP from 2008 to 2014.
- ✤ In 2014, he was elected as a councilor of the Bhimavaram municipal ward with the support of the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and also served as the incharge chairman during this period.
- ✦ He served as the State Secretary for BJP Andhra Pradesh from 2020 to 2023 and was elected as Member of Parliament from the Narasapuram constituency in the 2024 general elections.





Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (Retained)

- Bhupender Yadav has been a member of the Rajya Sabha, since 2012, representing the state of Rajasthan.
- He has served as the BJP's National General Secretary from 2010 to 2015.
- ✤ In July 2021, Yadav was inducted into the Union Council of Ministers and was given the portfolios of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, and Labour and Employment.
- ✤ After resuming official duties, he emphasized continued momentum around initiatives like Mission LiFE and plantation drive for sustainable environmental practices.

C.R. Patil



Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Jal Shakti (Newly Inducted)

- CR Patil is the state president of BJP Gujarat Unit and has been elected as a Lok Sabha MP from Navsari constituency for the fourth time.
- ✦ He has led the BJP Gujarat unit for the past four years and was instrumental in the party's seventh consecutive win in Gujarat assembly elections in 2022.
- ➔ He is known for his electoral expertise as he has won elections with very high margins. In the recent elections, he won by a margin of 773,000 votes — the highest in Gujarat.
- ✤ He stated that he will promote collective efforts and conserve water assets using latest technology and set new benchmarks in water conservation, sanitation and management.

Chirag Paswan



- Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Food Processing Industries (Newly Inducted)
- Chirag Paswan is the president of the Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) (LJP-RV). Under his leadership, (LJP-RV) won all the five seats contested in Bihar in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.
- He has been elected as a Member of Parliament in Lok Sabha for the third consecutive time. He secured a win from Jamui (Bihar) in 2014 and 2019 and from Hajipur (Bihar) in 2024.
- After taking over charge, Chirag Paswan chaired a review meeting of all ongoing schemes and directed the officials to work towards achieving the 100 days plan of the Government.



Dharmendra Pradhan



- Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Education (Retained)
- Dharmendra Pradhan joined politics as a member of Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) – BJP's youth wing and entered national politics in the year 2004.
- He has previously served as the Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas from 2014 to 2019 and was appointed as the Minister of Steel in 2019. In 2021, he was appointed as the Minister of Education and Minister of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship.
- As the Minister of Education, he was instrumental in implementation of schemes such as Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), and others.



Dr. Chandra Sekhar Pemmasani



MoS, Ministry of Rural Development MoS, Ministry of Communication (Newly Inducted)

- Dr. Chandra Sekhar Pemmasani is a Member of the Parliament (MP) from Guntur (Andhra Pradesh) constituency.
- He is a doctor by profession and has attended Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad and Geisinger Medical College Centre, Danville, Pennsylvania.
- He has served as an attending physician at Johns Hopkins University and Sinai Hospital for approximately five years and is the founder and CEO of UWorld, a test preparation company.

Dr. Jitendra Singh



MoS-I, Ministry of Science and Technology, MoS-I, Ministry of Earth Sciences; MoS, Prime Minister's Office; MoS, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions; MoS, Department of Atomic Energy; MoS, Department of Space. (Retained)

◆ Dr. Jitendra Singh is a physician by profession and has been elected to the Lok Sabha for the consecutive third time from Udhampur (Jammu and Kashmir). He has previously served in the Ministry of Science and Technology since 2021 and the Ministry of Earth Sciences since 2014.

→ As the Minister of State for Science and Technology, Dr. Singh launched India's first indigenously made research vessel, which marked a significant milestone in the country's scientific endeavors.

→ He has also contributed to the successful launch of several ISRO missions and has been instrumental in advancing the government's space exploration efforts.



Dr. L Murugan

MoS, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (Retained) MoS, Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs (Inducted)

- Dr. L. Murugan is a Member of the Rajya Sabha representing Madhya Pradesh since 2021. He contested the 2024 Lok Sabha Elections from the Nilgiris constituency unsuccessfully.
- He has previously served as the Minister of State for the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying and the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting.
- From 2020 to 2021 he served as the President of the BJP Tamil Nadu Unit, prior to which he served as the vice-chairman of the National Commission for Scheduled Castes (NCSC) from 2017 to 2020.



Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya



Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Labour and Employment Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (Reallocated)

- Dr Mansukh Mandaviya has served as a Member of Parliament (MP) in Rajya Sabha from Gujarat from 2012 to 2024 before being elected to Lok Sabha representing Porbandar constituency.
- In 2002, he was elected as youngest Member of the Gujarat Legislative Assembly (MLA). He has served as the Minister of Health & Family Welfare and Minister of Chemicals & Fertilisers from 2021 to 2024.
- He has also served as MoS, Ports, Shipping and waterways from 2016 to 2019 as the Union Minister for Shipping from 2019 to 2021.

Dr. Virendra Kumar



Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Social Justice and **Empowerment** (Inducted)

- Virendra Kumar is an eight-time Member of Parliament, winning his fourth consecutive election from Tikamgarh (Madhya Pradesh).
- He is a member of the Indian Council of World Affairs. (ICWA) and has served as the chairman of the General Purposes Committee, Lok Sabha.
- He has previously served as the Union Minister of State for Women & Child Development and Minority Affairs from 2014 to 2019.
- On assuming charge, he stated that the ministry will continue playing a crucial role in empowering persons with disabilities and socially, culturally and economically weaker sections.



Dr. Subrahmanyam Jaishankar

Cabinet Minister, Ministry of External Affairs

- (Retained) Dr. S. Jaishankar has been serving as External Affairs
- Minister from 2019. He has previously served as India's Foreign Secretary from 2015-18, Ambassador to United States (2013-15), China (2009-2013) and Czech Republic (2000-2004). He was High Commissioner to Singapore (2007-2009).
- ✤ He has served in other diplomatic assignments in Embassies in Moscow, Colombo, Budapest and Tokyo, as well in the Ministry of External Affairs and the President's Secretariat.
- ➔ He has been credited with managing to bring matters of foreign policy to domestic discourse, especially during India's presidency of the G20.
- After resuming office, he stated that his foreign policy would be based on India first approach.



Durgadas Uikey



MoS, Ministry of Tribal Affairs (Newly Inducted)

- Durgadas Uikey represents the constituency of Betul (Madhya Pradesh).
- ✤ Prior to his political career, he was a teacher. He successfully contested the 2019 Lok Sabha elections from Betul, marking his inaugural term.
- → His educational gualifications include an M.A. and a B.Ed., which he obtained from Jaywanti Haksar Government Post Graduate College, Betul, and B.Ed. College, Khandwa, respectively.

G. Kishan Reddy



Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Coal Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Mines (Reallocated)

- G. Kishan Reddy served as president of BJP in undivided Andhra Pradesh from 2010 to 2014 and became the first president of BJP in the newly-formed state of Telangana in 2014.
- He has been elected from Secundrabad Lok Sabha constituency for the second consecutive term and has served as the state president of BJP in Telangana.
- In the previous government, he has served as Minister of Tourism, Culture and Development of Northeastern Region of India from 2019 to 2024. He has also served as MoS Home Affairs from 2019 to 2021.
- Upon his resumption of office, he stated that one of the key goal will be to enhance revenue generation for the Central and State Governments through coal extraction and supply of coal to the power plants.



Gajendra Singh Shekhawat



- Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Culture Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Tourism. (Reallocated)
- Gajendra Singh Shekhawat started his political journey with ABVP and was elected as president of the Student Union at Jai Narain Vyas University (JNVU) in 1992. He has held various positions in BJP including National General Secretary of the BJP Kisan Morcha.
- He was first selected as a Member of Parliament to the 16th Lok Sabha in 2014 from Jodhpur (Rajasthan). In 2024, he is elected from the same constituency for the straight third term.
- He previously served as the Minister of Jal Shakti in from 2019 to 2024 and was instrumental in implementation of 'Jal Jeevan Mission'. As an MP he ensured expansion of the Jodhpur Airport, a long pending demand of locals.



George Kurian



MoS, Ministry of Minority Affairs MoS, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying (Newly Inducted)

- George Kurian has been with the BJP since its formation in 1980 and has held the position of the national vice-president of BJYM. He was also appointed as an OSD for former Minister of State for Railways, O. Rajagopal.
- He was the first Malayali to serve as the vice-chairman of the National Commission for Minorities. He later became a core committee member and vice president of the BJP's Kerala state unit.

Giriraj Singh



Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Textiles (Reallocated)


- Rajiv Singh has won the 2024 Lok Sabha elections from the Munger constituency of Bihar for the third time. He was elected from Begusarai once in 2004.

- Shobha Karandlaje is a Member of Parliament (MP) from Bengaluru Lok Sabha Constituency.
- She became the first woman MP to represent Bengaluru. She had previously served as a member of the Karnataka legislative council and held position of Minister of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj in the Karnataka state government.

Sukanta Majumdar

- Sukanta Majumdar, won his first parliamentary seat in 2019 Indian general election, representing Balurghat (West Bengal) constituency.
- As BJP's state president in West Bengal, he has been pivotal in strengthening the party's presence, especially in border areas. Majumdar serves on the Standing Committee on Information Technology and the Committee on Petitions.



Suresh Gopi



MoS, Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas MoS, Ministry of Tourism (Newly Inducted)

- Suresh Gopi is a prominent Malayalam actorturned-politician who became the first ever BJP candidate to win a Lok Sabha seat from Kerala. He represents the Thrissur constituency.
- From 2016-22, he was nominated as a Member of Parliament (MP) in the Rajya Sabha by the President of India. During this tenure, he served as a member in the standing committee of the Ministry of Communication and Information Technology and in the Consultative Committee for the Ministry of Civil Aviation. He also presided as a member of the Consultative Committee for the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and the Coconut Development Board.
- He previously contested the 2019 Lok Sabha General Elections and the 2021 Kerela Assembly Elections from the Thrissur constituency unsuccessfully.

MoS, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (Retained)

- Tokhan Sahu began his political career in 1994 as the Sarpanch of Surajpura village in Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh. He represents the Bilaspur (Chhattisgarh) constituency in the Lok Sabha.
- He has held prominent roles, including state president of BJP Kisan Morcha and member of the Women and Child Welfare Committee. In 2015, he became the parliamentary secretary in Chhattisgarh.





MoS, Ministry of Jal Sakti MoS, Ministry of Railways (Newly Inducted)

- V. Somanna is a Member of the Parliament (MP) from Varuna constituency in Karnataka.
- He has served as the Minister for Housing, Municipalities, and Urban Development, as well as the Minister for Higher Education in Government of Karnataka.
- He has also served as the Deputy Leader of the Opposition in the Karnataka Legislative Assembly.

Glossary

Lok Sabha

The Lok Sabha or House of the People is the lower house of the Parliament of India. The Lok Sabha is composed of representatives of the people from 543 constituencies, chosen by direct election on the basis of adult suffrage.

Rajya Sabha

The Rajya Sabha or Council of States is the upper house of the Parliament of India. Membership is limited to 250 members, 12 of whom are nominated by the President of India for their contributions to art, literature, science, and social services. The remainder of the body is elected by the state and territorial legislatures. Members sit for six-year terms, with one-third of the members retiring every two years. The Rajya Sabha meets in continuous sessions and, unlike the Lok Sabha, the lower house of Parliament, is not subject to dissolution.

Minister of State (MoS)

In India, a Minister of State is a junior minister in the Council of Ministers of the Central Government who assists a Cabinet Minister.

Minister of State-Independent Charge (MoS-I)

A Minister of State can also be assigned a ministry without a senior minister. Such a minister is given the title of Minister of State-Independent Charge.

Empowered Group of Ministers (EGoM)

EGoM is a Group of Ministers (GoM) of the Union Government who, after being appointed by the Cabinet or Prime Minister investigates and reports on specified matters and are also authorized (empowered) by the appointing authority to take decisions in such matters.

Group of Ministers (GoM)

Similar to the EGoM, a GoM investigates and reports on specified matters to the Cabinet. However, unlike the EGoM, is not authorized to take decisions.

Cabinet Committee

Prime Minister's Cabinet form the Cabinet Committees with assigned specific functions for smooth and convenient functioning of the government. A Cabinet Committee can be either set up with a broad mandate or with a specific mandate. Oftentimes, when an activity/agenda of the government acquires prominence or requires special thrust, a Cabinet Committee may be set up for focused attention. In all areas delegated to the Cabinet Committees, normally the decision of the Cabinet Committee in question is the decision of the prime Minister to decide if any issue decided by a Cabinet Committee should be re-opened or discussed in the full Cabinet.

Retained

Ministers continuing with the previous portfolio from the Ministry allocation in the last government.

Reallocated

Ministers assigned different portfolios from the Ministry allocation in the last government.

Inducted

Ministers assigned portfolios in this council, having served in previous governments.

Newly Inducted

Ministers having assigned portfolios for the first time.
